(Every week in these studies, we will ask questions about the Scriptures that try to help us Discover the unique Way of Jesus that is found in the text.)

- 1. Focus on John 3:27-30. How does knowing who God is and who we are in relationship to God lead to greater humility?
- 2. Read Philippians 2:6-7. How does self-emptying lead to spiritual maturity?
- 3. According to Hebrews 12:1, in order to persevere in the race, we have to throw off everything that can hinder us. Describe what some of those hindrances might be (as opposed to sins that entangle).

(This is the part of the study where we work on our own hearts. "How does my character need to grow and change because of this passage?"

- 4. In what area of life do you need to increase in trusting Jesus, and decrease in trusting yourself?
- 5. List some of the dangers of comparing ourselves to others.
- 6. Discuss how becoming "lesser" increases joy.

- 7. Do some summer cleaning: Make a list of those things you need to get rid of, brush off, or put back out on the shelves in order to grow again spiritually.
- 8. Plan a service project with your group in order to bring joy to the community around you (senior home, shut in, illness, etc.)
