THE KEY PRINCIPLE:

God permits what He hates to accomplish what He loves. (Lam. 3:32-33; Eze. 33:11; John 11:33; Isa. 45:7; Gen. 50:20; 1 Cor. 15:57; Rom. 8:37)

Jesus' prayer reveals ...

1. His certainty of the existence of God's plan. (17:1)

The Point: He understood that His <u>suffering</u> was a part of God's <u>predetermined plan</u> for His life. (Acts 2:23; John 9:3)

2. His confidence in the goodness of God's plan. (17:1)

The Irony: He knew His greatest <u>honoring</u> would come through His greatest <u>agony</u> on the cross. (Heb. 12:2)

THE LESSON:

Viewing suffering from an <u>eternal perspective</u> allows us to see a <u>good purpose</u> for it. (2 Cor. 4:17-18)

3. His worthiness of being exalted in God's plan. (17:2-5; Phil. 2:8-11)

The Request: "Reverse" that "self-emptying" process and restore My heavenly splendor and magnificence.

"I want to come home and be with the One I love."

THE KEY INSIGHT:

Jesus' glorified body will still bear the marks of His suffering so that He'll be honored for all eternity for paying the price to heal all our wounds.

(John 20:27; Rev. 5:12; 1 Pet. 2:24; Jer. 30:17; Rom. 8:18; Phil. 3:21; Rev. 21:5)
