EFCC Outreach: International Students

The United States hosts over 1 million international students each year, with over half of them from India and China alone. International students present an extraordinary opportunity for local Christians to offer hospitality and welcome. Many students will never be invited into a local home unless Christians engage with them. Some will never have lived in a place they can hear and freely consider the gospel. Some arrive with a great spiritual hunger. And many will rise to



positions of influence in their home countries.



Freddy Witjandra is an EFCC Global Worker who ministers to International Students coming to San Diego. Through weekly Bible studies, one-on-one discipleship, community-building activities and excursions, Freddy interacts with students from all over the world who are curious about Jesus.

Here are a few former students that have been impacted by Freddy and others in San Diego:

Akihisa came to San Diego to study from Japan. During his time in college, he accepted Jesus. After graduation, he received a job in Dhaka, Bangladesh where he began partnering with a church to minister to local students. He hosts a weekly Bible study in his home (pictured, right). Pray for the students that come to Aki's Bible study as he shares Jesus with them.



Shuan, a former student from China, has the heart to start small community gatherings with his coworkers. Pray for courage and protection as Shuan moves forward with these plans.
