Church-Planting in Mongolia





Mongolia — "the land of the blue sky" — is home to 3.4 million people. A completely landlocked nation, Mongolia has been caught between Soviet Russia and Communist China for much of its modern history. Today, over 30% of its people are nomadic. There are 28 people groups that call Mongolia home, and 22 of them are classified as "unreached people groups" by the Joshua Project.

Emmanuel Faith missionaries Eric and Debbie Smith have spent their lives training and coaching believers throughout Asia to plant churches. The Smiths are passionate about making disciples of Jesus who make disciples in Mongolia and beyond.



This month, Eric completed his second in-person training of 40 Mongolian leaders through the Church Planter Coaching Network. Participants commit to attending in-person conferences that Eric leads, engaging in monthly zoom training in cohorts, and putting multiplication into practice by coaching other leaders.



The Smiths have seen God multiply this work already — half of the 40 participants have formed their own networks of Mongolian churches. If all forty participants complete the year-long training, they will each be charged with the task of coaching 5 new leaders — adding 200 new Mongolian church planters and making significant progress toward discipling the nation!
