Our Challenge:

Let our heavenly allegiance control our earthly choices. (Matt. 6:33; John 18:36; Heb. 11:13-16; Col. 3:2; Phil. 2:14-15)

Heavenly allegiance is seen by ...

- 1. A steadfastness in spirit. (1:27; Josh. 24:15)
- **2.** A <u>unity of purpose</u>. (1:27; Eph. 4:32)
- **3.** A <u>confidence when opposed</u>. (1:28; 2 Tim. 3:12)

The Point: Facing opposition for our allegiance to a heavenly King gives evidence that we belong to Him. (Matt. 5:10)

4. A perspective when suffering. (1:29-30)

The Key Insight: Living with a heavenly allegiance gives an eternal perspective that enables us to see the spiritual purpose behind all the pain and suffering we're called to endure as Christ-followers.
